

TEAMSumter Student and Family Expectations

Program Expectations

- Students will participate in a structured distance learning program from home utilizing a school-issued computer or a personal device.
- Internet access is required.
- Live instruction will be provided remotely; students will have access to teachers during regular school hours five days per week.
- Secondary students will participate in daily video interactions during every academic period.
- Services provided through an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or a 504 Plan will be
 offered online as outlined in each plan. Services will be scheduled based on the school's
 master schedule to ensure a smooth transition to traditional setting when possible.
 Services will be provided in a small group, or one-on-one, as stated in each IEP or 504.

Attendance Expectations

- Attendance requirements are the same as in the traditional school setting and can be found in each school's student handbook.
- Attendance will be taken each period at the secondary level.
- Attendance will be taken daily, by teacher, at the elementary level.

Student and Family Expectations

- Students will login and be ready for class when the school day begins.
- Students will remain on the computer during structured program hours.
- Parents will ensure children and anyone within video view are appropriately dressed.
- Parents will ensure school appropriate language is used by all within video view.
- Parents will ensure students participate in services provided through an IEP or 504 when applicable. Services cannot be rescheduled as therapists are following the school's master schedule.

Instructional Expectations

- Students must complete a minimum of twenty-five instructional hours per week.
- Each student will receive and follow a daily schedule under the direction of their teacher(s). The daily schedule will include instruction and interaction with their

TEAMSumter teacher(s) in their core academic classes (i.e. English Language Arts and Reading, Social Studies, Math, and Science, etc.). Students will also participate in courses such as PE and music in elementary schools and a variety of electives for secondary schools.

Grading Guidelines

Grading will follow individual school grading policies and meet the guidelines of the Student Progression Plan:

- at least one grade will be recorded per subject, per week; and
- teachers will communicate failing grades to parents.

Learning Platform

Microsoft (MS) Teams will be the platform used for eLearning. This will include the following:

- distribution of e-binders/notebook information,
- video content delivery,
- video conferencing opportunities,
- teacher distribution of assignments,
- · students submitting assignments to teachers, and
- return of graded assignments.

Please note, instructional sessions may be recorded and posted to Teams for future use. Recorded sessions could be used as a reference by students during independent work assignments or after a student absence to ensure missed instruction is available during the completion of make-up work.

Teacher Absences

Should a teacher be absent, the teacher will assign independent work for the day and/or period, and a support staff member will be available for assistance during structured program hours.
